



# Looking in the wrong place?

My daughter once lost a wooden puzzle piece and we searched high and low for it, in amongst the toys, in the bedroom, behind the sofa, but it seemed to have vanished. One breakfast, I found it when I wasn't looking for it – a blue sheep sat inside the Ready Brek packet! I would never have thought of looking there!

On the first Easter Day as women came to Jesus' tomb to anoint his body, they met two men in shining clothes who said

#### Why do you look for the living among the dead?

If they wanted to find Jesus, they had gone to the logical place to look – the tomb that his body had been laid to rest in, but the women were told that they were looking for Jesus in the wrong place – they were looking among the dead when in fact he is alive . . .

If Jesus remains among the dead, we are left with a teacher who dies in his 30s as a failed Messiah, someone who makes great promises about God but comes to a pitiful end, why should we bother with a dead Jesus? If he remains among the dead, we can't really assume that anything he said is true or that he is worth following.

But if Jesus rose from the dead and we find him among the living, things start to look a bit different. We have someone in whom God is at work - so what he said and what he did are worth looking at. We are living in a world where God has stepped in, making things different now and offering hope for the future.

Yet still we tend to look for what Jesus gives in all the wrong places.

We think that we will be satisfied if we can have the most up to date iPhone or that brand of handbag or the next holiday. Our feelings of security are often caught up with our house or our salary or who are friends are. We are in danger of looking in the wrong places for God.

Perhaps we even still try to find Jesus among the dead?

Maybe we think Christianity has nothing to say beyond Jesus' death and we need to learn to follow a living person not a dead one. The Christian message of Easter is not

a message of the past – Jesus is alive today and we need to live in the light of that. That means that we can live as if we have been forgiven – because we have.

And if we decide to follow Jesus – we discover that being a Christian is not primarily about obeying a set of commandments or being religious, but enjoying a relationship with a living person.

So, look in the right places for what you need for your life – decide to take a look at the person of Jesus and you may well be surprised when you find him.
